Mrs. Alexcina M. "Cina" (Cudak) LaFleur, 96, of 180 Friend St. Adams, died Saturday afternoon, July 11, 2015, at Berkshire Medical Center in Pittsfield. She was born in Adams on July 18, 1918, daughter of the late John and Cecilia (Mee) Cudak. She attended the former Notre Dame Elementary School and graduated from the former Adams High School with the Class of 1937.

Mrs. LaFleur worked as a clerk at the former Arnold Print Works in Adams for many years until retiring.

She had been a communicant of Notre Dame des Sept Douleurs Church, Adams.

She enjoyed crossword puzzles and reading. She and her late husband loved to walk at the Greylock Glen, and talk with friends they met there, and taking their grandchildren there to walk while they "babysat".

Her husband, Norman F. LaFleur, whom she married on November 24, 1944, died on July 1, 2004.
