



## Alfred H. Kleiner

December 1, 1915 - January 11, 2008

Mr. Alfred Herman Kleiner, 92, of 105 Friend St., Adams, died on Friday morning, January 11, 2008, at his home surrounded by his family.

He was born in Adams on December 1, 1915, a son of the late Henry and Henrietta (Wolfrum) Kleiner. He attended schools in Adams.

Mr. Kleiner was a Veteran of World War II having served with the United States Army as a Sergeant in a field artillery unit in the European Theater from February 6, 1941, until his Honorable Discharge on November 30, 1945.

Mr. Kleiner worked as a Foreman for the former W.R. Grace Co., Adams, retiring in 1979 with 33 years of service. While employed there, he was responsible for overseeing the making of the world's largest print blanket, which was 312 feet long and 7611 inches wide.

He was a communicant of St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, Adams. He was a member of the Adams Post 160 American Legion, and the W.R. Grace Quarter Century Club. He enjoyed gardening, hunting, fishing, mushrooming, and traveling. Some of his favorite vacation spots were Hawaii, Mexico, Alaska, New Zealand, and Europe. He had also gone on several cruises, including the Panama Canal. He was fortunate to have shaken Pope John Paul's hand twice while in Rome with Father John Chwalek and his tour group.

He is survived by his wife the former Josephine K. Schultz, whom he married on April 11, 1942.
