Mrs. Alice M. (Perry) Dydowicz, 93 of North Adams passed peacefully at her home on December 20, 2020.

Alice was born in Winsted, CT on June 1, 1927 to the late Fred and Florence (Hurd) Perry, where she attended schools.

Mrs. Dydowicz worked for many years as a cashier for the former Adams Supermarket and Big Y Supermarket in North Adams until her retirement at age 87. So many people will remember Alice on register 7 where they waited in a long line specifically to be able to have a few minutes with her. She always had a box of goodies and stickers for children and if you were lucky, you would leave with a jar of her famous raspberry jam.

Alice was a longtime member of All Saints Episcopal Church in North Adams and was fond of the friendships that were formed there.

When not working or knitting blankets, sweaters and mittens for all of her loved ones, she loved spending time with friends and family. As a grandmother she would often get reprimanded by her daughters for spoiling her grandchildren and as a great grandmother she could often be found holding the babies and staring at them for long periods of time.

She was the proud and devoted wife of Edward Dydowicz from December 6, 1947 until the day she died even though he left this earth on March 21, 1989.

passed before her.
