Ann Olech Goral, 94, of Bethel Health & Rehab Center 13 Parklawn Drive Bethel, CT where she had resided for six years, died on November 7, 2009 following a brief illness.

Born in Chicago, Illinois on July 25, 1915, she was the daughter of Martin and Apolonia Augustyn Olech. She attended Chicago public and private schools and received an Associate Degree in English from Wright Junior College. Before retiring from the Chicago Public School System in 1980, she was an assistant librarian. An avid reader, she loved to travel and listen to operas. Her quiet sense of humor delighted those around her.

After moving from Chicago in 1974, she was a seasonal resident in Fort Lauderdale, Florida; in western Massachusetts and in Woodbury and Bethel, Connecticut. She was a devout communicant at St. John of the Cross Parish in Middlebury, CT for over ten years.

She was predeceased by her husband, Clemence Walter Goral, whom she married in 1938, in 1990. She leaves a son, Richard Goral of Seattle, Washington; a daughter, Marcella Goral Jackson; a son-in-law, Robert Blake Jackson of Woodbury, CT; and a sister-in-law, nieces and nephews in Florida, Texas, Maryland, and Illinois.

The funeral will be held on Thursday, Nov. 12th at 9:00 AM from the Paciorek Funeral Home, 13 Hoosac Street, Adams, followed by Liturgy of Christian Burial at 10:00 a.m. at Saint Mary of the Assumption Church, Cheshire, celebrated by Rev. David Raymond, Pastor.
