



## Arline P. Bedard

May 24, 1926 - January 1, 2008

Mrs. Arline P. (Sirard) Bedard, 81, of 1 Berkshire Square, Adams, died late Tuesday evening, January 1, 2008, at Berkshire Medical Center in Pittsfield. She was born in Adams on May 24, 1926, a daughter of the late Bernard and Antoinette (Markiewicz) Sirard. She moved to Hoosick Falls, New York as a child with her family, and attended schools there. She returned to Adams as a young woman, and then graduated from the former Bliss Business School in North Adams.
