Mr. Arthur C. Bourdon, 90, of 17 Pleasant St., Adams, died on Friday, April 4, 2014 at North Adams Commons.

He was born in Adams on April 20, 1923, a son of the late Arthur and Edna (Hampel) Bourdon. He attended schools in Adams and graduated from the former Adams High School.

Mr. Bourdon was a veteran of World War II, having served with the 10th Mountain Division of the United States Army. He received his Honorable Discharge on November 22, 1945.

Mr. Bourdon worked for many years as a mechanic in the Naval Ordnance Division of the former General Electric Co., Pittsfield.

He was a communicant of the Parish of Blessed John Paul and the former St. Thomas Aquinas Church, Adams. He was a member of the 10th Mountain Division, New England Chapter.

He is survived by his wife, the former Jeannette M. Boucher, whom he married on September 21, 1946,
