



Bernard S. Blazejewski

May 12, 1946 - April 16, 2010

Mr. Bernard S. Blazejewski, 63, of Holly Ridge, North Carolina, a native of Adams, died Friday, April 16, 2010, at New Hanover Regional Medical Center in Wilmington, N.C. following a brief illness.

He was born in Adams on May 12, 1946, son of Phyllis (Dabrowski) Blazejewski and the late Theodore Blazejewski. He attended St. Stanislaus Elementary School and graduated from the former Adams High School in 1965.

He enlisted in the US Army in 1966, and served in Boblingen, Germany with the 472nd Signal Co., until being sent to Vietnam in 1968, where he was stationed at Vung Tan. He was Honorably Discharged as specialist 4th class on April 20, 1969.

Before entering the Army, Mr. Blazejewski worked for the former Adams Supermarket at the Artery Arcade, North Adams. After returning from Vietnam, he attended the former North Adams State College and graduated from Berkshire Community College in 1972 with an Associate Degree in Electronic Engineering Technology.

After graduating, Mr. Blazejewski went to work for the United States Navy in the Naval Ordnance Division at General Electric Co., Pittsfield. He then moved to North Carolina where he continued his work with the Navy until retiring.

He was a member of the Burnette-Bednarz Post 1995 Veterans of Foreign Wars, North Adams, and Post 9983 Veterans of Foreign Wars, Holly Ridge,

NC. He enjoyed collecting and restoring antiques, stamp collecting and working out.
