



## Mr. Bradley A. Baker

April 3, 1933 - December 15, 2024

Mr. Bradley Alan Baker, 91, of Lenox, died on Sunday, December 15, 2024, in the presence of family, at his son's home in Middlefield.

He was born in Corry, PA on April 3, 1933, a son of the late Ralph and Margaret (Trill) Baker. He attended schools in Corry and graduated from the Corry High School.

Mr. Baker was a military veteran, having served with in the United States Army where he was stationed in Germany serving as an Aircraft Mechanic.

Mr. Baker last worked as a mechanical engineer for Cavaleiro Plastics in Pittsfield until retiring. Earlier Previously, he had worked for General Electric Co., Pittsfield and had owned and operated the former Baker's Service Center on Tyler Street in Pittsfield.

He was predeceased by his son, Daniel Baker; his granddaughter, Amanda Baker; two brothers, William and Robert Baker; and by his sister, Mary Baker.
