Mr. Byron David "Dusty" Johnson, 72, of 23 Grove St. Adams, died Friday evening at North Adams Regional Hospital.

He was born in Adams on August 13, 1934, a son of the late George and Carrie (Mahar) Johnson, and attended Adams schools, graduating from the former Adams High School in 1953.

Mr. Johnson last worked at Specialty Minerals Corp. in Adams for 30 years, until retiring in 1996. Earlier, he had worked at the former Arnold Print Works in Adams, and at Excelsior Printing in North Adams.

He was a member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Adams, where he served as a Vestryman and member of the Choir, as well as a volunteer for many church activities.

He had served for several years with Company M of the Massachusetts National Guard, and was a volunteer driver for the Road to Recovery program of the American Cancer Society.

He was an avid reader and had enjoyed hunting.

He is survived by his wife of 50 years, the former Earline E. Looman, whom he married on May 11, 1957;
