Mrs. Carmen (Macchia) Lemanski, 91, of Adams, died peacefully on Tuesday, January 26, 2021 at Williamstown Commons surrounded by her family.

In their retirement years, Larry and Carmen would take bus trips to Foxwood Casino, vacation at the Cape and attend winter Red Sox games in Fort Myers.

Her husband Lawrence died on September 27, 2007.
