March 28, 1925 - January 3, 2013

Charles "Chuck" J. Welch, age 87, died in his sleep January 3 at home. Born March 28, 1925 in Adams, MA, to Thomas and Glorina, he graduated from Adams High School in 1943 and immediately enlisted in the Army. Chuck served in both the Atlantic and Pacific Theaters on the Acadia, a cruise ship recommissioned as a hospital ship. On September 28 1953, he married Mary Rowley, the love of his life. Mary passed away on October 28, 2012.

Chuck worked in the transformer department at General Electric and as a sales manager for DuBois Chemical Co. until retiring in 1988.

He was a lifelong member of St Thomas Church, served in the Knights of Columbus, and volunteered for Catholic Charities. Chuck also served as a Deputy Sheriff, School Committee Member, and Town Assessor. He was a multi-gallon blood donor, delivered meals on wheels until this year, and as a visitor was a tireless deliverer of good cheer to the residents and staff of the Williamstown Commons.

In retirement he enjoyed walking, tending his yard and gardens, rooting for the Red Sox, and most especially supporting, entertaining, and talking about the accomplishments of his seven grandchildren and one great-granddaughter.

Survivors include sons: Thomas and wife Joelle of Williamstown; Michael and wife Susan of Portland, ME; Charles and wife Jacqueline of Scituate, MA; also grandchildren: Kyla, Conor, Lauren, Luke, Olivia, Finn, and great-granddaughter Neve, along with many nieces and nephews.
