



Chester A. Harrison

March 4, 1931 - February 3, 2013

Mr. Chester Albert Harrison, 81, of 46 Notch Rd. Adams, died on Sunday, February 3, 2013 at Craneville Place, Dalton.

He was born in Colchester, Vermont on March 4, 1931, a son of the late Charlie and Mary (Frodyma) Harrison. He attended schools in Adams and graduated from the former Adams High School. He had also attended the DeVry Technical Institute in Chicago.

Mr. Harrison was a Veteran of the Korean War, having served as a Sergeant in the Second Indian Head Division of the United States Army. He received his Honorable Discharge on May 27, 1952.

Mr. Harrison worked as an independent truck driver for most of his life and had also worked as an electronics technician for General Electric Co., Pittsfield.

He was a communicant of St. Mary of the Assumption Church, Cheshire. He was a member of the Adams Post 160 American Legion.

He is survived by his wife of 58 years, the former Evelyn Kuczynski, whom he married on June 6, 1954;

He was predeceased by his brother, Charles Harrison.

The funeral will be on Friday, February 8, at 8:45AM from the PACIOREK FUNERAL HOME, 13 Hoosac St., Adams, followed by a Liturgy of Christian Burial at 10:00AM in St. Mary of the Assumption Church, Cheshire, celebrated by Rev. David R. Raymond, Pastor.
