



Donald P. Bourdon

Mr. Donald Paul Bourdon, 88, of 25 Adams Road, Williamstown, formerly of 75 Commercial St., Adams, died on Wednesday evening, March 7, 2012 at Williamstown Commons.

He was born in North Adams on April 18, 1923, a son of the late Joseph and Mary Louise (Bissaillon) Bourdon. He attended schools in North Adams.

Mr. Bourdon was a veteran of World War II having served with the United States Army Air Corps. from 1942 until he received his Honorable Discharge as Corporal in 1946.

Mr. Bourdon worked as an Electrical Maintenance Supervisor at the former Sprague Electric Co., North Adams for many years, until retiring.
