May 27, 1934 - November 4, 2006

Mrs. Dorothy May (Loc) Kozik, 72, of 2 Burnett St. Adams, died early Saturday morning at Williamstown Commons.

She was born in Adams on May 27, 1934, a daughter of the late Bruno and Helen (Sikora) Loc. She attended Adams schools, graduating in 1951 from the former Adams High School, where she was a member of the National Honor Society and participated in the Girl's State program.

Mrs. Kozik worked at the former Old Stone Mill in Adams as the office manager for 40 years, until retiring in 1996.

She was a communicant of St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, Adams. She was a member of the Adams Town Democratic Committee, where she was its secretary/treasurer for many years.

She enjoyed reading, swimming, shopping and politics.

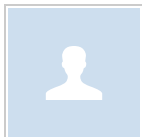
