



## Edward J. Starsiak

July 11, 1921 - August 25, 2007

Mr. Edward John Starsiak, 86, of 17 Pleasant St. Adams, died early Saturday morning, August 25, 2007, at Berkshire Medical center in Pittsfield.

He was born in Adams on July 11, 1921, a son of the late John and Katherine (Midura) Starsiak, and attended Adams schools.

Mr. Starsiak was a Veteran of World War II, serving with the US Marine Corps in the Pacific Theater and Iceland from 1940 until his honorable discharge as a Corporal in 1945.

Mr. Starsiak worked at the former Arnold Print Works in Adams for many years, until retiring in 1982.

He was a communicant of the Parish of Notre Dame and St. Thomas Aquinas as well as St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, Adams, and was a member of the Disabled American Veterans.

He enjoyed hunting, fishing and golfing.

His wife, the former Sadie Restino, whom he married on September 5, 1952, died August 2, 1998.

He is survived by 3 daughters - Patricia Ward of Worcester, MA;

Deborah Stack and her husband, Kevin, of Tomball, Texas; and Mary Ann Cardinal and her husband, William, of Pownal, VT;
