Mrs. Emilia "Millie" (Piekos) Jajko, 89, of Wells Road, Cheshire, died Thursday morning, November 25, 2010, at Berkshire Medical Center in Pittsfield.

She was born in Cheshire on September 20, 1921, a daughter of the late Jan and Karolina (Bulsa) Piekos, and attended local schools.

Mrs. Jajko last worked as a cook and cafeteria manager for the Adams-Cheshire Regional School District from 1962 until her retirement in 1988. She also worked for many years assisting in running the family farm in Cheshire.

She was a communicant of St. Mary of the Assumption Church, Cheshire, and was a member of the Cheshire Garden Club. She was a past member of several local farm associations.

She was an avid gardener, and maintained extensive perennial gardens for many years. She enjoyed various crafts, reading, woodworking, and riding on her tractor.
