



Mr. Frank E. Wandrei

November 18, 1921 - September 24, 2021

Mr. Frank Edward Wandrei, 99, of Adams, died on Friday, September 24, 2021, at Mt. Greylock Extended Care Facility in Pittsfield.

He was born in Adams on November 18, 1921, a son of the late Frank and Josephine (Ramocki) Wandrei. He attended schools in Adams and graduated from the former Adams High School with the class of 1940.

Mr. Wandrei was a Veteran of World War II, having served with the United States Navy as an Aviation Machinist in the Black Hat Squadron having been awarded the Presidential Unit Citation and the Distinguished Flying Cross. He received his Honorable Discharge on December 11, 1945.

Mr. Wandrei worked as a senior lab technician for the former W.R. Grace Company in Adams, retiring in 1984.

He was a communicant of the Parish of St. John Paul II at St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, Adams. He was a member of the Northern Berkshire Retired Men's Club and the Stamford Country Club.

His wife, the former Wanda M. Raczka, whom he married on September 1, 1945, died on July 25, 2001.

He is survived by his son David Wandrei of Savoy; his daughter, Marilyn Armstrong of Pittsfield; two sisters, Mildred Tinger of Canaan, NY and Florence Jennings of Adams; two grandchildren, Kelly Buff of Agawam and Michael Wandrei of Windsor; one great grandson, Nathan Wandrei and by many nieces and nephews.

Funeral services and burial will be private.

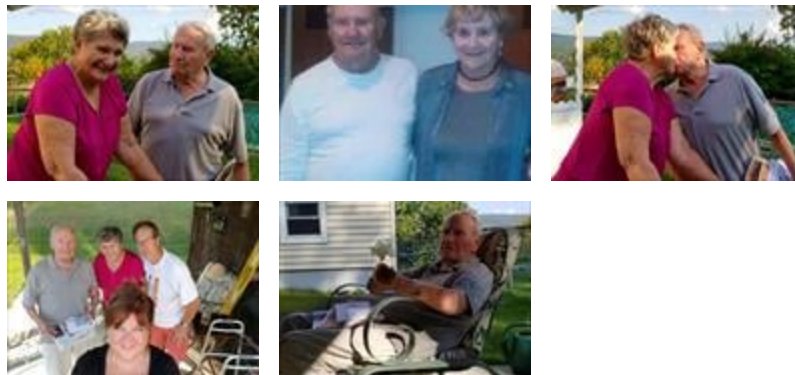
