



## George W. Kirk

March 9, 1925 - April 29, 2013

Mr. George "Bill" Kirk, 88, of Adams, died on Monday, April 29, 2013 at his home surrounded by his family, after a long determined battle with cancer. He was born in Montgomery, New York on March 9, 1925, a son of the late Leslie Kirk and Marguerite (Pardee) Griswold Brown. He attended schools in Adams and graduated from the former Adams High School. He also graduated from the former Bliss Business College in North Adams.

Mr. Kirk was a Veteran of World War II having served with the United States Army from 1943 until receiving his Honorable Discharge in 1946.

Mr. Kirk worked as a bookkeeper and office manager for many area businesses, the last being the former Scarfoni Ford, North Adams. He had also worked for the former Berkshire Fine Spinning Co., Adams.

He was a communicant of the Parish of Blessed John Paul, Adams. He was a member of the United States Association of Ballroom Dancers and had traveled extensively as a dance host on cruises all over the world. He enjoyed dancing, hiking, gardening, crafting, traveling, vacationing in New Hampshire and spending time with his grandsons and nieces and nephews.

His wife, the former M. Louise Franchomme, whom he married on May 21, 1949, died in 2002.
