



## Miss Helen A. Soja RN

Helen A. Soja, R.N., 94, formerly of Adams, died Saturday, May 18, 2019, at Berkshire Medical Center.

She was born in Adams on July 26, 1924, a daughter of the late John and Anna (Kuna) Soja. She graduated from St. Stanislaus Elementary School in 1938, from the former Adams High School in 1942, and from the former St. Luke's School of Nursing, Pittsfield, in 1947. Miss Soja last worked as a Registered Nurse for the late Dr. Chaim Wildman in Pittsfield for many years, until retiring. Earlier, she had worked at the former W.B.
