



## Helen G. Zieba

February 24, 1909 - February 21, 2007

Mrs. Helen G. (Zajac) Zieba, 97, of 18 Summer St., Adams, died Wednesday morning February 21, 2007, at Berkshire Medical Center, Pittsfield.

She was born in Adams on February 24, 1909, a daughter of the late Krysten and Agata (Wojtowicz) Zajac. She attended schools in Adams, including St. Stanislaus Elementary.

Mrs. Zieba worked for many years at the former Berkshire Fine Spinning Co., Adams, until the mill ceased operations. She then ran a catering business at the former Summer Street Hall, Adams.
