



James S. Varellas

January 23, 1941 - March 28, 2007

Mr. James Steven Varellas, 66, of 7 Grandview Terrace, Adams, longtime local businessman, died unexpectedly Wednesday afternoon, March 28, 2007, at his home.

He was born in Sparta, Greece on January 23, 1941, a son of Stavros and Stavroula (Masganas) Varellas, and attended schools in Greece. While there, he served with the Greek Army, and was also a firefighter for a brief period. He came to the United States in 1966, settling in the Berkshires.

Together with his wife, Stacy, Mr. Varellas was the owner and operator of the Pizza House in Adams from 1992 until his death. He had owned and operated the Pizza House in North Adams from 1966 until selling that restaurant in 2004.

He was a member of St. George Greek Orthodox Church in Pittsfield. He enjoyed sports, especially New York Yankee baseball.

He is survived by his wife, the former Stacy J. Vagia, whom he married on September 18, 1977;
