Mrs. Joan Elaine "Babcia" (Lesnick) MacTavish, 73, of 101 Friend St., Adams, won her 4 year battle with terminal cancer on April 11, 2011, when she entered the arms of her Lord at Berkshire Medical Center, Pittsfield.
