Mr. John Joseph "Jack" Nowicki, 65, of 9 Bobs Hill, Adams, died peacefully at his home on Monday, April 8, 2013.

He was born in Adams on April 20, 1947, a son of Stephen and Mary (Skubel) Nowicki. He attended schools in Adams and North Adams and graduated from the former St. Joseph High School in North Adams.
