May 21, 1945 - December 3, 2009

Mr. Joseph Eugene Geist, 64, of 9 ♦ East Hoosac St., Adams, died on Thursday, December 3, 2009 at the North Adams Regional Hospital.

He was born in North Adams on May 21, 1945, a son of Myrtle (Wiles) Geist, and the late Charles Ernest Geist, who was originally from Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. He was also the grandson of the late J. Tevelyn Wiles and V. Blanche Lamphier. He attended schools in Williamstown and graduated from Mt. Greylock High School with the class of 1963.

Mr. Geist was a Veteran of the Vietnam War, having served with the United States Navy on the U.S.S. Glover and the U.S.S. Norton Sound, until being Honorably Discharged.

Mr. Geist worked for several years as a printer for the former Arnold Print Works, Adams, and the former V.O. Max, Plainfield.

He was a member of the Forest Park Country Club, Adams. He enjoyed playing golf and fishing.

His wife, the former Karen E. Walsh, whom he married on March 8, 1969, died on January 14, 2002.
