



Kazimier Piekos

Kazimier L. "Kasey" Piekos, 66, of 828 Sandmill Road, Cheshire, a longtime local businessman, died early Friday morning at his home following a short illness.

He was born in Adams on November 14, 1938, a son of the late Jan & Karolina (Bulsa) Piekos, and attended schools in Cheshire and Adams, graduating from the former Adams High School in 1957.

Following his graduation, he worked for Rolling Acres Farm in Cheshire until 1960. He then worked at the former Hunter Machine Co. in North Adams until 1964, when he started his own business, Mt. Greylock Vault Co. in Adams, which manufactured burial vaults and concrete steps and septic tanks. He also owned and operated the former Bellevue Bouquet & Memorials in Adams for several years. In 1980, he developed Sunset Acres Farm in Windsor, which he operated for the past 25 years.

He enjoyed volleyball, motorcycling, snowmobiling and restoring antique tractors. He also enjoyed polka music & dancing.

He was a communicant of St. Mary of the Assumption Church, Cheshire.
