Mrs. Laretta M. (Jones) Loughman, 82, of 1 Berkshire Square, Adams, formerly of Northampton and Chicopee, died Thursday, July 12, 2007, at her home.

She was born in Northampton on May 29, 1925, daughter of the late David and Yvonne (Brais) Jones. She attended St. Michael's Elementary and High Schools in Northampton.

Mrs. Loughman was primarily a homemaker, but had worked as a waitress and bookkeeper following her graduation in 1942.
