Mr. Lawrence "Larry" Edward Lemanski, 82, of 13 Bieniek Avenue, Adams, died on Thursday September 27, 2007, at Berkshire Medical Center, Pittsfield.

He was born in Adams on June 2, 1925, a son of the late Walter and Alice (Zaik) Lemanski. He attended schools in Adams, and graduated from the former Adams High School.
