



## Lincoln T. Keller

May 13, 1964 - June 30, 2007

Lincoln Thomas Keller, 43, of 60 West Burt St. Adams, a longtime Adams firefighter,

died Saturday morning, June 30, 2007, at his home.

He was born in Adams on May 13, 1964, the son of Thomas A. and Jean M. (Nuttelman) Keller. He attended Adams schools, and graduated from C.H. McCann Technical High School in 1982.

Mr. Keller was a machinist and mechanic by trade, and had worked in that capacity for various companies in the area, including Pierce Machine Co. in Adams, Jiminy Peak, Beloit Lenox Division, and Holland Company and Specialty Minerals Inc. in Adams, until ill health forced his retirement in August of 1995.

A longtime Adams firefighter, Mr. Keller was elected to membership of the Alert Hose Company No.1 on May 6, 1986, and completed 21 years of service this past May.

He was a member of Troop 38 of the Boy Scouts of America, Adams, and had achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. He was a member of the Adams Sno-Drifters and the Berkshire Chapter of the Harley Owners Group. He was also a former member of the Adams Forest Wardens.

He enjoyed motorcycling, snowmobiling, skiing, camping and fishing. He was also an accomplished artist, and enjoyed sign painting.

Besides his parents, of Adams, he is survived by 1 son - Preston T. Keller of Adams,

1 Sister - Kimberly Tremblay and her husband, Daniel, of Adams;  
1 Nephew - Raymond Skowronski of Adams;  
2 Nieces - Natasha Skowronski and Ashley Tremblay, of Adams; and several aunts, uncles, and cousins.

The funeral will be held on Thursday, July 5th, at 9:45 AM from the PACIOREK FUNERAL HOME, 13 Hoosac St. Adams, followed by services at 11:00 AM in the First Baptist Church of Adams, conducted by Rev. Donald E. Gray, Pastor.

Burial will follow in Bellevue Cemetery, Adams.

Calling hours are Tuesday, July 3rd, from 4 to 7 PM at the funeral home.

Due to the observance of Independence Day, there will be no services or visitation on Wednesday, July 4th.
