



## Lucille L. Goyette

March 27, 1919 - February 20, 2006

Mrs. Lucille Louise (Gagnon) Goyette, 86, of 3 Myrtle St. Adams, died Monday evening, February 20, 2006, at Williamstown Commons.

She was born in Adams on March 27, 1919, a daughter of the late Emery and Louise (Dupre) Gagnon, and attended Adams schools, graduating from the former Adams High School.

Mrs. Goyette last worked with the kitchen staff at the former Adams Rest Home in Adams, until retiring 25 years ago. Earlier, she had worked at the former W.B. Plunkett Memorial Hospital for many years, until it closed in 1975. She was a communicant of the Parish of Notre Dame & St. Thomas Aquinas, Adams, and was a Gold Star Mother. She was very active for over 30 years in the Memorial and Veterans Day ceremonies in Adams. She also enjoyed crocheting and needlework.

Her husband, Harold G. Goyette, whom she married on September 7, 1940, died on March 9, 1972.

She is survived by 2 sons- Bruce G. Goyette and Assistant Fire Chief Paul J. Goyette,

both of Adams;

5 grandchildren - Andrew, Tammy, Evan, Katie and Nathan Goyette, all of Adams;

She was predeceased by 2 sons - Glenn S. Goyette on Dec. 30, 1965, and

Robert T. Goyette, who died during the Vietnam War on October 22, 1968. The funeral will be held on Saturday, February 25th, at 9:00 AM from the AUGÉ-PACIOREK-SIMMONS Funeral Home, 13 Hoosac St. Adams, followed by a Liturgy of Christian Burial at 10:00 AM in St. Thomas Aquinas Church, Adams, celebrated by Rev.
