Mrs. Marilyn Ann (Koczela) Styczynski, 61, of 4603 Abbington Dr. Harrisburg, PA, a native and longtime resident of Adams, died Sunday morning, August 26, 2007, at Select Specialty Hospital in Camp Hill, PA.

She was born in Adams on March 6, 1946, a daughter of Eileen (Cyr) Koczela and the late Fred Koczela. She attended Adams schools, and graduated from the former

Adams High School. She lived in Adams until moving to Pennsylvania in 1995.

Mrs. Styczynski last worked as a claims processor for Aetna Insurance Co. in Allentown, Pennsylvania, for several years until 2001. While in Adams, she worked as a paraprofessional for the Adams Cheshire Regional School District for 13 years, and had also worked at Sears and the former Singer Sewing Machine stores in Pittsfield.
