



Mary V. Milos

November 11, 1905 - December 28, 2005

Mrs. Mary Victoria (Bulsa) Zieba Milos, 100, of 34 ♦ North Summer St. Adams, died Wednesday morning at Williamstown Commons.

She was born in Manchester, New Hampshire on November 11, 1905, a daughter of the late Peter and Katherine (Gancarz) Bulsa, and came to Savoy as a child with her family, moving to Adams as a young girl. She attended Savoy schools.

Mrs. Milos last worked at Sprague Electric Co. in North Adams for 20 years, until retiring in 1970. Earlier, she had worked at the former Berkshire Fine Spinning Co. in Adams for many years, and , still earlier, had done domestic work for the late Drs. Shea and Gangemi.

She was a communicant of St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, Adams. She was a member of the Polish Women's Club and the Adams Senior Citizens.

Her first husband, Walter Zieba, died in 1949. Her second husband, Matthew "Jake" Milos, whom she married in 1954, died on May 30, 1993.
