Mrs. Norma G. (Lewis) Laine L'Ecuyer, 72, of 17 Pleasant St., Adams, died early Saturday morning, April 3, 2010, at North Adams Commons.

She was born in Adams on November 23, 1937, a daughter of the late Charles and Blanche (Dubia) Lewis. She attended schools in Adams and graduated from the former Adams High School with the class of 1956.

Mrs. L'Ecuyer last worked as the secretary for St. Mark's Episcopal Church, Adams. She had lived in Hawaii from 1991 until moving back to Adams in 1996. While in Hawaii she was the secretary for St. Theresa's Church.

She was a communicant of the Parish of Pope John Paul the Great, Adams, and served as a Eucharistic Minister for several years, and taught Catholic Christian Doctrine for 41 years. She was the former secretary of the Notre Dame PTG, the Cartier Club, the Franco-American of Massachusetts and the Sunday Nighter's mixed bowling league. While in Hawaii she was the secretary for the Ladies of Sacred Heart.

Her first husband, Robert Laine, whom she married on July 27, 1957, died on April 6, 1984.

She is survived by her husband, Robert L. L'Ecuyer, whom she married on June 23, 1989;
