Mrs. Patricia M. (Peloquin) LeBeau, 85, of 5 Overlook Terrace, Adams, died Saturday evening, April 9, 2011, at her home.

She was born in South Hadley Falls, MA on March 15, 1926, daughter of the late Oakley and Celina (O'Neil) Peloquin. She attended the Clarke School for the Deaf, Northampton.

Mrs. LeBeau last worked at the former W.R. Grace Corp. in Adams for 20 years, until retiring in 1991. Earlier, she had worked at the former Hunter Outdoor Products Co. and Sprague Electric Co.

She was a communicant of the Parish of Pope John Paul the Great, Adams, where she had served as a Eucharistic Minister. She had been a religious education teacher for the Diocese of Springfield Ministry with the Deaf, and was a member of the Pittsfield Athletic Association for the Deaf, the Western MA Athletic Association for the Deaf, and the International Deaf Catholic Association Chapter 121.

She enjoyed gardening, cooking, and especially sewing, and sewed many items, including curtains, for many local families.

Her husband of 61 years, Lawrence L. LeBeau, whom she married on June 10, 1950, died on February 14, 2011.

She is survived by a son, Patrick LeBeau, Sr. and his wife, Dione, of Adams; a daughter, Linda Casella, of Adams;
