



Pearl V. Stewart

March 2, 1916 - November 29, 2008

Mrs. Pearl V. (Chamberlain) Stewart, 92, of 25 Adams Road, Williamstown, a former longtime resident of 178 East Road, Adams, died on Saturday November 29, 2008, at Berkshire Medical Center, Pittsfield.

She was born in Forest Dale, Rhode Island on March 2, 1916, a daughter of the late Irving and Jessie (Burlingame) Chamberlain. She attended schools in Adams and graduated from the former Adams High School with the class of 1935.

Mrs. Stewart was a dedicated Registered Nurse who was trained in the North Adams Regional Hospital's Nursing Program. She provided health care in Northern Berkshire County in many capacities including the former Plunkett Hospital, Adams, the former Hillcrest Hospital, Pittsfield, North Adams Regional Hospital, two Doctor's offices, two nursing homes, and finally as a Visiting Nurse for the Visiting Nurse Association, North Adams, until retiring in 1988.
