Robert Francis “Dubber” Dalton, 91, of Adams died April 22, 2024 at Berkshire Medical Center. He was born in Adams on October 27, 1932, son of the late Delbert and Loretta (Bissaillon) Dalton. He attended Adams schools and graduated from the former Adams High School in 1950.

He was a Veteran of the Korean Conflict, serving with the US Air Force from 1952 until his Honorable Discharge as Airman 1st Class in 1956. He was a member of the Local 151 Plumbers and Steamfitters Union for many years until his retirement. He leaves behind a legacy that will forever be etched in the hearts of those he touched.
