



Robert Dixon

August 9, 1918 - February 8, 2012

Mr. Robert Dixon, Jr., 93, of 52 Leonard St., Adams, died on Wednesday, February 8, 2012 at North Adams Commons.

He was born in Adams on August 9, 1918, a son of the late Robert and Elizabeth (Todt) Dixon.

He attended schools in Adams and graduated from the former Adams High School in 1937.

Mr. Dixon was a Veteran of World War II, having served in the U.S. Army with the 76th division and the 385th infantry division until receiving his Honorable Discharge on July 1, 1945.

Mr. Dixon was employed by General Electric Co., Pittsfield for 17 years as a toolmaker and methods engineer, he also worked for the former New England Telephone Co., for 4 years then went to work for the former Pfizer Co., Adams for 23 years until retiring in 1980.

He was a longtime member of the First Congregational Church of Adams and a member of the Berkshire Lodge of Masons and the Adams Post 160 American Legion.

His wife, the former Rena White, whom he married on January 30, 1941, died on February 2, 1994.

He is survived by his daughter and her husband, Donna and Richard Collings of Adams, his granddaughter Danene Campbell, 2 great grandsons, Chad and Collin Campbell and his longtime companion Rolande Trottier.

He was predeceased by 2 brothers, David and Charles Dixon and by his sister

Jean Wilson.
