



## Ronald A. Brassard

October 16, 1948 - April 21, 2013

Mr. Ronald A. "Oval" Brassard, 64, of 44 Richmond Lane, Adams, died Sunday morning, April 21, 2013, at his home.

He was born in Adams on October 16, 1948, son of the late Harry and Mildred (Sudacki) Brassard. He attended Adams schools, and graduated from the former Adams Memorial High School in 1967.

Mr. Brassard worked in the Ordnance Division of General Electric Co. in Pittsfield for 23 years. He then worked for the Bruckner Supply Co. and finally for WESCO International, Inc. in Port Washington, NY until retiring in 2012.
