



## Stella Burnett

Mrs. Stella (LeBeau) Burnett, 96, of Epworth Arms, 350 West St. Pittsfield, formerly of 17 Pearl St. Adams, died Saturday morning, November 27, 2010, at Hillcrest Commons in Pittsfield.

She was born in Adams on September 16, 1914, a daughter of the late Arthur and Almina (Bourdeau) LeBeau. She moved to Cheshire as a child with her family, and attended schools in Adams and Cheshire.

Mrs. Burnett worked as an inspector at the former Jarisch Paper Box Co. in North Adams for 33 years, until retiring in July of 1991. Earlier, she had worked at the former Berkshire Fine Spinning Co. in Adams.

She was a communicant of the former Parish of Notre Dame and St. Thomas Aquinas, Adams.

Her husband, Elansford A. Burnett, whom she married on September 4, 1933, died on April 6, 1993.
