Mr. Steven Paul Kuta, 55, of 106 Howland Ave., Adams, died suddenly on Monday evening, July 6, 2009, at the North Adams Regional Hospital. He was born in Pittsfield on July 16, 1953, a son of the late Paul and Vivian (Tracy) Kuta. He attended schools in Cheshire and graduated from Hoosac Valley High School with the class of 1971. He was an outstanding offensive and defensive lineman for the football team, as well as a shot-putter in track. Upon his graduation, Mr. Kuta worked as a plumber for Francis McGrath, and General Electric. He eventually became a union member with the Plumbers/Pipefitters Local 151, Chicopee.

He was a communicant of St. Mary of the Assumption Church, Cheshire. Steve was very active with the Church and was a former member of the Parish Counsel. He was a member of the Polish National Alliance, Adams, and a past member of the Hoosac Hose Company, Cheshire. Steve was well-known throughout the Adams-Cheshire area as a hard worker, with a ready simile and a good joke. He very much enjoyed reading, particularly newspapers, and discussing current events.
