Mrs. Suzanne "Tootsie" (Pikul) Gagnon, 87, of 20 Gilead Street, Adams, died on Tuesday November 25, 2008 at Sweet Brook Care Center, Williamstown. She was born in Brattleboro, Vermont on September 20, 1921, a daughter of the late Lawrence and Mary (Wojeck) Pikul. She attended schools in Adams and graduated from the former Adams High School.
