Mr. Theodore Joseph Biros, 82, of 24 Richmond Lane, Adams, died on Tuesday, January 6, 2009, at the North Adams Regional Hospital.

He was born in Adams on October 27, 1926, a son of the late Peter and Maria (Tomaszewski) Biros. He attended schools in Adams.

Mr. Biros was a Veteran of World War II, having served with the United States Army from 1946 until his Honorable Discharge in 1947.

Mr. Biros worked for 41 years as an auto mechanic for Grundy's Garage, Williamstown, and McAndrews-King, Adams, until retiring in 1992.

He was a communicant of the former St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, Adams.

He was a member of the Maple Grove Civic Club, Adams, and a longtime member of the St. Stanislaus Kostka Society, Adams. He was an avid Boston Red Sox and New England Patriots fan. He enjoyed going to the casinos and his favorite pastime was working on cars.

He is survived by his wife of 55 years, the former Dorothy Davison, whom he married on September 19, 1953;
