Mr. Thomas A. Koehler, 95, of Adams, died on Wednesday, January 9, 2019 at Williamstown Commons.

He was born in Adams on February 11, 1923, a son of the late Arthur and Irene (Goyette) Koehler. He attended schools in Adams and graduated from the former Adams High School with the class of 1941.

He was a Veteran of World War II, having served with the United States Navy Merchant Marines until receiving his Honorable Discharge in 1946.

He was predeceased by a grandson Christopher Corkins and by his brother
