



Veronica B. Mcandrews

April 7, 1914 - October 23, 2005

Mrs. Veronica B. (Gebarowski) McAndrews, 91, of 3 Myrtle St. Adams, died Sunday morning at Williamstown Commons.

She was born in Adams on April 7, 1914, daughter of the late Albert and Katherine (Muron) Gebarowski, and attended Adams schools.

Mrs. McAndrews was a homemaker most of her life, but had worked for several years at the former Waverly Fabrics in Adams.

She was a communicant of the Parish of Notre Dame & St. Thomas Aquinas, Adams. She was a member and Past President of the Polish Women's Club, a member of Court Sancta Regina 904 Catholic Daughters of the Americas, Adams; a member of the St. Thomas Rosary Sodality and a member and past Director of the Adams Council on Aging. An avid quilter, she was a member of a local quilting club.

She enjoyed spending time with her family.

Her husband, Michael J. McAndrews, whom she married on October 22, 1936, died on February 14, 1962.
