



## Victoria Mendel

Mrs. Victoria Ann (Pezdek) Mendel, 92, of 9 Manners Avenue, Adams, died Friday evening, October 2, 2009, at Williamstown Commons.

She was born in Manchester, New Hampshire on December 23, 1916, daughter of the late Albert and Aniela (Sroka) Pezdek. She moved to North Adams with her family when she was two years old, and attended schools there, graduating from Drury High School.

Mrs. Mendel first worked in the cloth room of the former Hoosac Cotton Mill in North Adams until her marriage. During World War II, she worked at Sprague Electric Co. in North Adams. After raising her children, she worked in the ordnance division of the General Electric Co. in Pittsfield for 18 years, until retiring in 1980.

She had been a communicant of St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, Adams. She was a member of the St. Stanislaus Rosary Sodality, the Adams Senior Citizens and the General Electric Pensioner's Club. She enjoyed knitting, gardening, dancing and music.

Her husband, Matthew F. "Tracy" Mendel, whom she married on June 26, 1937 in St. Francis of Assisi Church, North Adams, died on March 9, 1996.

She is survived by a son, Tracy A. Mendel, of Adams;

a daughter, Nellie Ann Kelley and her husband, John, of Humarock, MA;

a brother, Alec Pezdek of Houston, Texas;

3 Grandchildren, 9 Great Grandchildren, and several nieces, nephews, grandnieces & grandnephews.
