



Victoria A. Mularski

August 27, 1924 - December 17, 2010

Miss Victoria Alice Mularski, 86, of 68 Orchard St. Adams, died Friday morning, December 17, 2010, at North Adams Regional Hospital.

She was born in Adams on August 27, 1924, a daughter of the late Walter and Frances (Meczywor) Mularski. She attended St. Stanislaus Kostka Elementary School, and graduated from the former Adams High School. She received her Bachelor's degree in biology from Syracuse University, and then attended Cornell University.

Miss Mularski worked as a consultant in flavor analyses at Arthur D. Little Corp. in Cambridge, MA from 1954 until 1970. While there, she worked as head of a laboratory panel working for major companies such as Campbell's Soup, Anheuser-Busch, McDonald's Corp., Gerber, General Electric and many others. Her work led her to travel extensively throughout the United States and the world. After retiring from Arthur D. Little, she operated her own consulting firm in the same field, until finally retiring in the early 1980's. She received many honors in her field, and was named in the 16th edition of Who's Who of American Women.

She had been a communicant of St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, Adams, and was a member of the St. Stanislaus Rosary Sodality and the Polish National Alliance. She was also a member of many professional associations and societies relating to her field.

She is survived by a sister, Helen Mularski, with whom she resided; a brother, Walter Mularski and his wife, Midge, of Pittsfield;

a nephew, Marc Mularski, of Pittsfield; 2 nieces, Marisa Ronan of Hingham, MA and Marla Sigman of Andover, MA; 6 grandnephews and 2 grandnieces. The funeral will be held on Tuesday, December 21st, at 8:45 AM from the PACIOREK FUNERAL HOME, 13 Hoosac St. Adams, followed by a Liturgy of Christian Burial at 10:00 AM in St. Mary of the Assumption Church, Cheshire, celebrated by Rev. David Raymond, Pastor.

Burial will follow in St. Stanislaus Kostka Cemetery, Adams.

Calling hours are Monday from 4 to 7 PM at the funeral home. Members of the St. Stanislaus Rosary Sodality will meet at the funeral home at 3:45 PM to pay their respects and recite the Rosary.
