Willard Raymond "Beaver" Bard, 79, of 3 Myrtle St., Adams, died on Monday, January 20, 2014 at his home.

He was born in Adams on February 17, 1934, son of the late Willard and Exilda (Vanier) Bard. He attended schools in Adams.

Willard served his country in the US Army and the National Guard where he was honorably discharged from both. Willard worked for the Town of Adams for many years in the Parks Department until retiring as parks supervisor. He also served as a longtime member of the Adams Park Commission and a member of the Maple Grove Civic Club. He was a communicant of the Parish of Blessed John Paul, Adams.

Willard devoted his life to the youth of Adams through sports. He was a coach for over 55 years for the Adams Little League baseball, Adams Police Athletic League basketball and the Adams Church League basketball. The town of Adams recognized Willard's dedication to the towns youth in 1989 by dedicating the newly renovated Little League baseball field the Willard Beaver Bard Little League Park. In 2005 Governor Mitt Romney recognized Willard by awarding him the Governors Point of Light Award for his dedication to the youth of the town of Adams.

Willard's wife, the former Jacqueline Bostwick, passed away January 20, 2004.

He is survived by his sister, Shirley Trudeau and her husband Richard of Adams;

His niece, Jacqueline Pedercini of Adams and his nephews, Gary Trudeau and his wife Elizabeth of Cheshire and Charles Bombardier of Clarksburg;

His great nieces and nephew, Jennifer Kuczynski, Sarah Pedercini, Michael Pedercini and Rachel Green.

He was predeceased by his sister, Helen Krok.

The funeral will be on Saturday, January 25, at 11:00AM from the PACIOREK FUNERAL HOME, 13 Hoosac St. Adams, followed by a Liturgy of Christian Burial at 12:00 NOON in the Parish Church of Blessed John Paul, celebrated by Rev. John Gawienowski.

Burial will follow in Bellevue Cemetery, Adams.

Calling hours are Friday from 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM at the funeral home.

“ Shirley and Family: Some thoughts I'd like to share. It's been more than a month since Beaver, my life-long friend, passed away. I was fortunate enough to have visited with him just days before his death, and was able to pay my respects at his wake and funeral. Now my thoughts often return to the early 1950's, the days of our youth, when Beaver and I were neighbors on the banks of the then-unrestrained Hoosic River, living in apartment buildings across the street from each other and adjacent to the Dean Street bridge. In those pleasurable times, he and I led the Spring Street Boys into battle against the Renfrew Gang, North Summer Street Crew, and any other other town pickup teams that "dared" to visit our makeshift ball park on Spring Street, at its intersection with Dean, or perhaps travel to neutral Russell Street Field. Whatever sport was in season, that's what we played, in one situationally modified form or another, seemingly all day, year-round. In those days, prior to his military service, Beaver also was known as the Jet, or the Flash--due to his remarkable speed and quick feet around the bases, down the football field, or on the court. Many years later, when I finished my own military career, I returned home with my family in 1978 to find "Coach Bard" a well-established figure in Adams youth sport programs. Afterward, he coached my son, and grandsons, for many seasons, in Little League, Police Athletic League, and Church League contests. The seasons often culminated in championships and featured long winning streaks--something of great pride to the "Coach" and all his players. After my wife and I moved back to her native NC in 1990, we both maintained contact with Beaver, making it a point to try and visit with him at least once during each return visit to Adams. Now, he is gone, but I'm sure he will remain a part of Adams sports lore for as long as that memorial rock at the Willard R.
